EDI Documentation BISS ABRUFE

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1. Introduction

This documentation describes the BSH message "BISS ABR". It can be used for data interchange involving delivery schedules between the factories of BSH Hausgeräte GmbH and its suppliers.

BISS means Business Integration Services Supply Chain, ABR means delivery schedules (Abrufe).

We have created this data format especially for smaller companies without an EDI system. Advantages:

- Readable data format (transmission in German or English is possible)
- Viewing with internet browser, "notepad", etc. is possible
- Message content can be processed automatically
- Transfer via internet mailbox (BSH-FX Data Exchange Server) is possible

"BISS-ABR" messages can be transferred by AS2, OFTP and BSH-FX Server. A transfer via GXS-network is not possible. The syntax of the message is <u>not</u> oriented toward international standards. Suppliers thinking about starting EDI with other customers should preferable opt for EDIFACT messages!

2. Message Syntax

A "BISS ABR" message has a very simple syntax:

- Every row has 120 digits and ends with a line break.
- The first 40 digits define the content of the row or indicate a new chapter.
- The remaining 80 digits contain the information.

Chapters are declared with the following keywords:

The last row begins with "End". End -----

As a reference the filename will be transferred again

If you want to use the message for automatic processing you should take account of the following:

- One file can have several positions (delivery schedules)
- Each position can have several schedule lines
- Cancellations have a "position" but no "schedule-line"!
- Cancelled scheduling lines will not be transfered in every case! Transfers are status quo, not updates!
- It should not be a problem if we send more keywords/rows with the next versions.

4. Notes on the Example

The file enclosed contains 3 positions.

The 2nd position is a cancellation.

The 3rd position contains a backorder.

5. Supplements

October 2006, Version 1.1, Extention for the turkish BSH-factory:

We added the fields "Ref-invoice number" and "Ref-place" to the chapter "schedule-line". This fields/lines will only be send if the data content is not empty. Ref-invoice number: Suppliers invoice number (custom processing). Ref-place: Place of the goods.

February 2015:

- Changed company name to "BSH Hausgeräte GmbH"
- Changed WebEDI system name from BISS (BISS4) to BSH-FX

February 2017:

- Since 1.06.2017 BSH is sending a pickup date qualifier to identify the scheduling date: "Pickup (P)/Delivery date (D)"
- In the near future BSH could send date and time: "Scheduling line time", format HHMM or empty/blank
